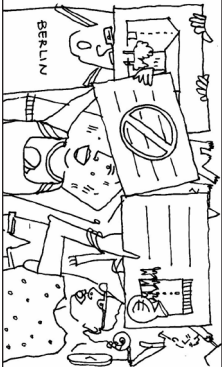


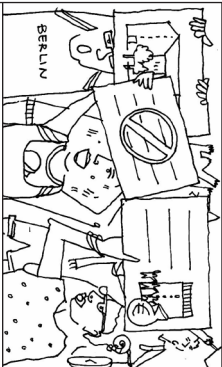

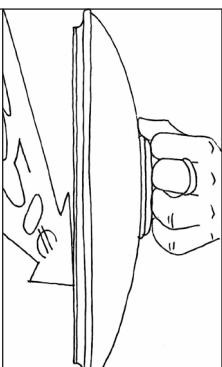
PROTESTS

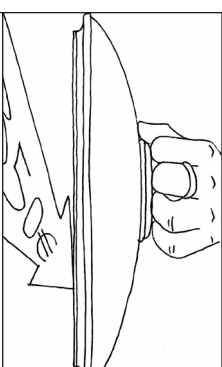
RENT CAP

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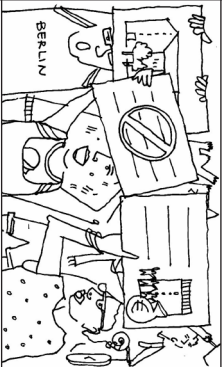
RENT CAP

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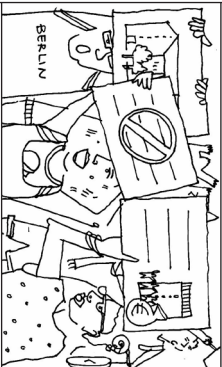
PROTESTS

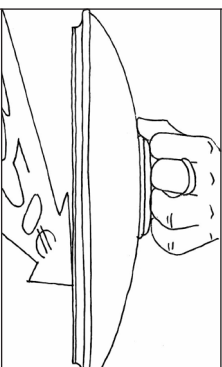
PROTESTS

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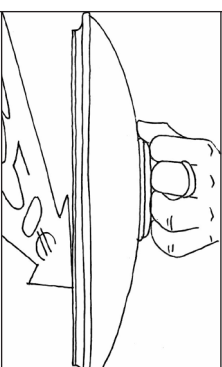
RENT CAP

RENT CAP



"[The rent cap is being examined.] The result is open, a decision is expected [soon]. As long as no decision has been made on the main issue, [it] applies and you can't refer to the fact that it's still pending before the Federal Constitutional Court." [4]

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
